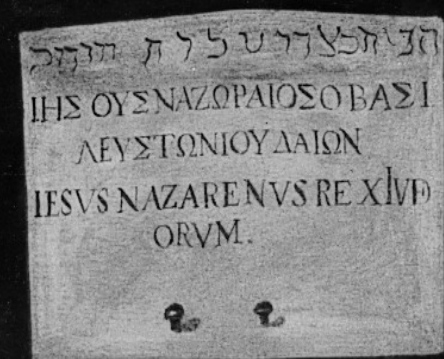
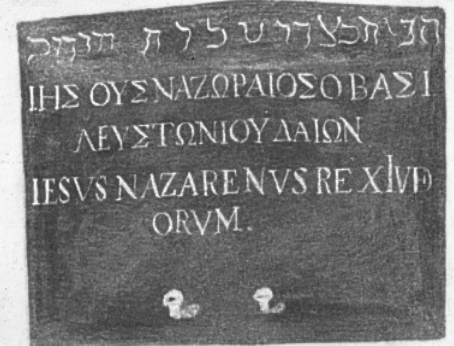

§ 2383. REBELLION OR INSURRECTION

Whoever incites, sets on foot, assists, or engages in any rebellion or insurrection against the authority of the United States or the laws thereof, or gives aid or comfort thereto, shall be fined not more than \$10,000 or imprisoned not more than ten years, or both; and shall be incapable of holding any office under the United States.

§ 2384. SEDITIOUS CONSPIRACY

If two or more persons in any State or Territory, or in any place subject to the jurisdiction of the United States, conspire to overthrow, put down, or to destroy by force the Government of the United States, or to levy war against them, or to oppose by force the authority thereof, or by force to prevent, hinder, or delay the execution of any law of the United States, or by force to seize, take, or possess any property of the United States contrary to the authority thereof, they shall each be fined not more than \$5,000 or imprisoned not more than six years, or both.

§ 2385. ADVOCATING OVERTHROW OF GOVERNMENT

Whoever knowingly or willfully advocates, abets, advises, or teaches the duty, necessity, desirability, or propriety of overthrowing or destroying the government of the United States or the government of any State, Territory, District or Possession thereof, or the government of any political subdivision therein, by force or violence, or by the assassination of any officer of any such government; or

Whoever, with intent to cause the overthrow or destruction of any such government, prints, publishes, edits, issues, circulates, sells, distributes, or publicly displays any written or printed matter advocating, advising, or teaching the duty, necessity, desirability, or propriety of overthrowing or destroying any government in the United States by force or violence, or attempts to do so; or

Whoever organizes or helps or attempts to organize any society, group, or assembly of persons who teach, advocate, or encourage the overthrow or destruction of any such government by force or violence; or becomes or is a member of, or affiliates with, any such organization

classification of evil divides it into two broad types: moral and natural. Some examples may help to distinguish them. One of the worst nightmares a parent could experience occurred in Orange County, California, on June 10, 1991. An eleven-year-old girl, Jaycee Dugard, was on her way to school when she was abducted. Her stepfather was in eyesight of the event, spotting someone grabbing the girl and shoving her into a pickup truck. The stepfather

that banned cross burning carried out with the intent to intimidate.¹⁴ The Court held that, at least in theory, states could prohibit such cross burnings as a "true threat."¹⁵ Specifically, intimidation can be prohibited as "a type of true threat, where a speaker directs a threat to a person or group of persons with the intent of placing the victim in fear of bodily harm or death."¹⁶ Cross burning could fall within this category of "intimidating speech," given that the "history of cross burning in this country" demonstrated they were often "intended to create a pervasive fear in victims that they are a target of violence."¹⁷ However, the Court concluded that the specific state law before it was unconstitutional insofar as it allowed the mere fact of cross burning to provide prima facie evidence of the intent to intimidate, creating a chill on constitutionally protected speech.¹⁸
